Message from the Rector

Trinity Sunday. From Advent until now we have journeyed through a remarkable season of celebration. We have spent time with Jesus in the wilderness, walked with him through the days of Holy Week, and heard the first rumours of resurrection and new life. We have then walked with the early Christian community through the Acts of the Apostles, through Paul's letters, and through the resurrection stories found in the Gospels - until we arrived at Pentecost, where the church exploded into life with the gift of the Holy Spirit.

And now, today, we arrive at Trinity Sunday.

Trinity Sunday is sometimes treated as the most difficult Sunday of the Christian year - the day when preachers reach for complicated diagrams and apologise in advance for the theology. But the doctrine of the Trinity is not a puzzle to be solved or a formula to be memorised. It is an invitation to know God as he actually is.

God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit - not as three separate Gods, nor as three masks worn by one solitary deity, but as one God whose very life is a community of love, of relationship, and of creative joy. This is who God has always been, and this is the God who has revealed himself to us in Jesus Christ and in the gift of the Holy Spirit.

And here is the extraordinary thing - this God, whose life is an eternal communion of love, has created us to share in that life. We are not accidental by-products of an indifferent universe. We are made in the image of the Triune God, called into relationship with him and with one another. When we gather together as a congregation in Langley - people from many nations, many cultures, many backgrounds - we are not just a community of like-minded individuals. We are a sign of what the Triune God is like: unity that does not erase difference, love that reaches across every boundary, life that is richer for its diversity.

This Trinity Sunday, may we rejoice in the God who gives us life - the Father who created us and calls us his own, the Son who has come to meet us and through whose life, death and resurrection our sins are forgiven and our humanity restored, and the Holy Spirit who sanctifies, renews and transforms us, that we may become more and more like Jesus.

To God - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - be all glory, now and for ever. Amen.
